Greetings from your Newfound Friend!

It is a great privilege to be invited to serve as Community Spiritual Director for Perth Emmaus. I look forward to serving the Community and our Lord.

A bit about myself. My pilgrim walk was with the Drakensberg Community in South Africa in 1996 when I was minister at Upper Umgeni Presbyterian Church in Howick, KwaZulu-Natal. I served as ASD or SD each year after that in the Community until we came to Australia in 2009.

In Australia I was first minister in Merredin and joined the Great Southern Community. I served as Community Spiritual Director until I was called to Lighthouse Church in Geraldton and distance made it difficult to serve the role effectively. I have though assisted as ASD on a few Walks since then in the Great Southern. I have not been connected with the Perth Community other than through your visits to Geraldton during my time there.

Currently I am the General Secretary of the Uniting Church on Western Australia which has demanded a huge amount of my time. After three years in the role and with great supportive staff, I find myself in a more flexible position and able to offer more to the Emmaus Movement which has been such a support and inspiration in my Christian journey. My wife Margaret and I have three children and nine grandchildren all living in WA.
