Bringing others to Jesus: John 4: 4-42

One of the most beautiful stories of grace and acceptance is found in John's Gospel. In chapter four, we find Jesus tired from his journey sitting by the well – it was during the heat of the day and Jesus was thirsty.

Presently a woman came by, and Jesus asked her for a drink. It is such a simple request that we might not realize the significance of it. But this basic invite proved to be groundbreaking, esteem building and life changing. This simple request honored this person's value and changed her life forever.



We need to understand that in this cultural setting men did not address women (Note the disciples' reaction in Vv 27). Furthermore, this lady was a Samaritan and "Jews do not associate with Samaritans" (Vv9). And if that's not enough to persuade Jesus to keep His distance, this woman is an outcast; a person of questionable morality (Vv16-18).

Jesus abandons convention and uses the water from the well to lead into a conversation about "Living water". "People soon become thirsty again after drinking this water", He says, "But the water I give them takes away thirst altogether. It becomes a perpetual spring within them, giving them eternal life." (Vv13-NLT)

As a result of Jesus supernatural ability to disclose her life story, the woman finds this living water Jesus is offering.

What is astounding is the immediate response of this woman to Jesus. Without delay she was compelled to bring others to experience the grace she had found. As a result, many Samaritans believed, not because of secondhand hearsay, but because of their own personal encounter with "the Revealer of Mysteries" (Daniel 2: 29 – NIV) which leads to faith.

One of the most important tasks in Emmaus is sponsorship (It could arguably be the most important). It is our opportunity to bring others to Jesus and to allow them to experience the grace and acceptance we have enjoyed on our Emmaus Walk. Therefore, it is something that must be taken very seriously. Prayer is the basis for the Emmaus movement and primary for the job of sponsoring Pilgrims. Ask God to reveal who He would have you invite and be prepared to do the work of a good sponsor. Who knows maybe your Pilgrim's response after finding a deeper communion with Christ on this year's walk will be, "Now we believe because we have heard him ourselves, not just because of what you told us. He is indeed the Savior of the world." (John 4: 42)

A Commitment to Sponsorship

"Wise sponsorship is purposeful and prayerful; unwise sponsorship is haphazard and nondiscerning. Wise sponsorship eventually will produce a balanced, theologically centered movement of the Holy Spirit.

Unwise sponsorship eventually will produce a harvest that becomes more of a burden than a blessing for the church."

Sponsorship is the most important job in Emmaus

Sponsorship is the lifeblood of our community. We all want a positive weekend to take place and the Pilgrim to start off correctly. Regardless of how you were sponsored, we all need to consider how to and whom to sponsor. We really need to focus on the important details of sponsoring a candidate to an Emmaus event.

First consideration in sponsoring is prayer; you should be in prayer for the individual that God is leading you to approach about the Walk. If married, you should be willing to sponsor both husband and wife. Sponsoring even one person in the nurturing love of the community is a time-consuming activity. Will the added burden of sponsoring another person on the same Walk compromise your ability to be a good sponsor? Perhaps you could obtain someone to co-sponsor in order that all the responsibilities of sponsorship are adequately met.

Why do we sponsor pilgrims on the walk to Emmaus?

The aim of the sponsor is to bring spiritual revitalisation to Christians who, in turn, will bring new life and vision to the work of the church in the congregation, home, workplace, and community. The aim of sponsorship is to build up the Body of Christ.

Who do I sponsor?

Emmaus is for active Christians and members of churches whose own renewal will mean new energy, commitment, and vision in the church and everyday environments for Christ's sake. There are several qualities a prospective pilgrim should possess:

- First, the person should already be on a pilgrimage, willing to grow and move forward in their journey of faith.
- Second, the person should have a Christian passion. The pilgrim knows God can make and has made a difference in their life.
- Third, the person isn't so consumed by life's circumstances that they are unable to give full attention to the message and experience of Emmaus.

Have you considered sponsoring the following:

- church leaders (pastors and laypersons) who will bring new vision, commitment, and understanding back to their congregations and who need the renewal and grace Emmaus channels;
- dependable church members who are the quiet backbone of the church;
- less active members who need their awareness of grace rekindled and their commitments renewed;
- Christians who are hungry for "something more" and who want to grow spiritually;
- Respected laypersons and clergypersons whose participation, support, and leadership
 will encourage others to attend the Walk and will build a sound, balanced leadership
 base for the movement in the community; and
- members of diverse congregations, denominations, and ethnic groups.

Emmaus is right for many people – *but not for everyone*. The religious background or emotional condition of some people may make Emmaus an improper discipleship tool for them. Others may be unsuitable for sponsorship because of the negative effect they might have on an Emmaus weekend or the divisive influence they might bring to the church. Sponsorship requires sensitivity to these factors.

Some examples of questionable sponsorship are as follows:

- Non-Christians;
- Christians whose theology and/or practice is notably different or incompatible with the traditional theology and practice represented by The Walk to Emmaus;
- persons undergoing an emotional crisis (for example, family breakup, job loss, severe grief) or who are psychologically unstable;
- "church-hoppers" those who always have an axe to grind against the church; persons who will use Emmaus as a tool to divide the body, to further their own theological agendas, or who will create an "Emmaus church"
- persons who are always looking for another spiritual high or another experience to help them "arrive".

A potential sponsor need not feel like a failure if a prospect says no. Perhaps the timing is not right. Perhaps God will renew the person in another way. Remember, The Walk to Emmaus is not the way to renewal for every Christian.

How do I sponsor?

- 1. **Pray** for the person's openness to God's call to discipleship, not for how to get him or her to go on a Walk.
- 2. **Extend an invitation**. Invite the person to attend for the sake of a more vital relationship with Jesus Christ, not just an event to go to. Share your faith; explain the basic elements of the Walk, its purpose, and follow-up dimensions, which help us live in grace for the rest of our lives. Take the attitude that you are offering the person a wonderful gift rather than that they need to go.
- 3. Ask the person to make a commitment by **filling out the registration form**.
- 4. **Continue to pray** for your prospective pilgrim. Once the pilgrim has been assigned to a Walk, begin your preparations and enlist the support of their pastor. Please make sure that all preparations for your pilgrim's weekend are properly taken care of. Be sure you understand what forms of agape are appropriate for the weekend.
- 5. **Support** the Walk through your participation in the 72-Hour Prayer Vigil and your presence at Sendoff, Candlelight and Closing. Support the pilgrim's family by house-sitting, baby-sitting, feeding pets, watering plants, or just checking in with a spouse to see if any help is needed. For this reason it is best not to sponsor more than one pilgrim or a couple at a time.
- 6. **Encourage** the pilgrim in his or her Fourth Day involvement. Talk to them about their weekend experience. Help the pilgrim find or start a reunion group. Take the pilgrim to the first Gathering after their Walk. You could even offer to baby-sit so your pilgrim can attend a Candlelight.
- 7. **Help** the pilgrim re-enter their church and consider ways to act out new commitment and enthusiasm.
- 8. **Inform** the pilgrim about ways to serve the Emmaus community on future Walks, creating agape and writing letters to other pilgrims.
- 9. Help the pilgrim understand how to sponsor others.

What do I do now?

Seek our Lord's guidance through prayer – who is He leading you to sponsor this year.

A Plea to the Community

We have gaps in the full coverage of all the board roles.

- We have a vacancy in Music this year, due to our loyal Julie Marshall having to have time off the board. (by regulation - three years plus an optional extra three years maximum on the board then minimum one year off before re-applying) It's Julie's second time on the Board. Thank you Julie for your loyalty and willingness to serve and delight at doing so.
- Some board roles (as you can see) are doubled up with the one person. This is not a good practice to follow for too long.

Next year there will be more vacancies. **IF YOU** can see that you may be ready to fill in any role, **ask about** coming along to work with one of the people who will be leaving the board this year – then next year you won't feel like being thrown in the 'deep end' so to speak.

Another area for concern is the sparse number of Clergy to adequately fill the roles available each year. Having the same people too frequently on the walks year by year, Clergy or lay team, allows compliancy to enter the scene. This also is not a good practice. PLEASE pray about sponsoring a Pastor/Minister as a Pilgrim – the way we all start in Emmaus.

Agape


