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Reflection James 2:14-26

¹⁴ My brothers and sisters, what good is it if people say they have faith but do nothing to show it? Claiming to have faith cannot save anyone, can it? ¹⁵ Imagine a brother or sister who is naked and never has enough food to eat. ¹⁶ What if one of you said, "Go in peace! Stay warm! Have a nice meal!"? What good is it if you do not give them what their body needs? ¹⁷ In the same way, faith is dead when it does not result in faithful activity.

¹⁸ Someone might claim, "You have faith and I have action." But how can I see your faith apart from your actions? Instead, I will show you my faith by putting it into practice in faithful action. ¹⁹ It is good that you believe that God is one. Ha! Even the demons believe this, and they tremble with fear.

²⁰ Are you so slow? Do you need to be shown that faith without actions has no value at all?

²¹ What about Abraham, our father? Wasn't he shown to be righteous through his actions when he offered his son Isaac on the altar? ²² See, his faith was at work along with his actions. His faith was made complete by his faithful actions.

²³ So the scripture was fulfilled that says, Abraham believed God, and God regarded him as righteous. What is more, Abraham was called God's friend. ²⁴ So you see that a person is shown to be righteous through faithful actions and not through faith alone. ²⁵ In the same way, wasn't Rahab the prostitute shown to be righteous when she received the messengers as her guests and then sent them on by another road? ²⁶ As the lifeless body is dead, so faith without actions is dead.

Thoughts to Ponder:

- **How will I serve Jesus?**
- **When I serve Jesus, no act of kindness is too small.**

- Good sponsorship is the first act of Agape.
- Good sponsorship undergirds the whole weekend with sacrificial love on behalf of each pilgrim embodying the personal commitment of the community to each pilgrim
- Good sponsorship is the foundation for a healthy, effective Emmaus Movement that is fulfilling its true purpose: the development of Christian leaders and the renewal of the church in ministry

NATIONAL EMMAUS CONFERENCE 2024

This was held via Zoom on 23 March.

Perth Emmaus was well represented by Joy and Eric Loughton, Ross Patterson, Karen Handley, and Cathy O'Dea

Jo Toi, the National Lay Director, with support from Mostyn Krollig, the National Newsletter Editor, led the meeting. Christine Rose, the National Spiritual Director, led a time of devotion and prayer.

After the AGM, break-out groups were formed to engage members in discussion on several subjects including how we can engage the support of the local church as members of Emmaus.

Discussion summaries were shared.

Many of the issues we face here in WA in engaging members in the movement and encouraging them to both sponsor and serve on teams are experienced elsewhere across the nation.

Various strategies were discussed, and successes and obstacles were shared. The movement is keen to encourage younger members to step up to leadership to ensure the Emmaus community continues to have an impact.

The National Secretariat will be discussing the information gathered on the day to support the work of the movement.



Stéphane Brooks was the guest speaker at the conference. He is employed by the Emmaus Ministries Board in the USA, where

he continues to work to provide spaces for persons to experience God's grace in new and profound ways.

WHAT IS AGAPE?

The word agape was used by early Christians to refer to the self-sacrificing love of God for humanity and the reciprocating love toward God and among one another. In simple terms, agape means love, as in the love of God.

In the Emmaus Movement, agape acts are special acts of prayer, sacrifice, and expressions of Christian love on behalf of a Pilgrim by another Christian.

What are examples of agape acts and when are they presented?

- Sponsorship of another pilgrim is the ultimate act of agape since by prayerfully seeking God's guidance and through self-sacrifice, you can bless another individual with the experience of three days in His presence.
- Agape letters from other communities and the 72-hour prayer vigil are introduced on Friday afternoon and illustrate God's love for everyone

through community prayer and sacrifice.

- On Saturday, the pilgrims become increasingly aware of table agape which is the same for everyone but shows up as a gift for each person, reflecting the fact that God loves us all the same but cares for each of us individually.
- On Sunday afternoon, the personal agape letters from family and friends communicate God's love for each pilgrim in personal ways that are unique through relationships.
